The days started at 5:30 AM. The students prepared their own breakfast and held morning devotions before going to work digging trenches for the local Maasai community's new water supply. After lunch, Starfish students tutored at the local primary school. In the evenings, they are dinner, discussed the day, prayed together, and sometimes watched a movie before turning in for some much needed rest.

Before retuning to their schools, the students made an overnight excursion to Lake Magadi Hot Springs. It was quite an adventure as they cooked over an open fire and slept under the stars. The perfect bit of fun after a week of hard work.
